




# Help North Atlantic Right Whales!



## What You Can Do:

### Keep Watch

Endangered right whales visit our waters year-round; sometimes swimming close to shore. They can be difficult to spot. **STAY ALERT** and **LOOK OUT** for whales!

### Slow Down

If you see a right whale, **SLOW DOWN** to 10 knots. Vessels 65 feet or greater in length must travel 10 knots or less in Seasonal Management Areas: [www.greateratlantic.fisheries.noaa.gov/shipstrike](http://www.greateratlantic.fisheries.noaa.gov/shipstrike).

### Move Away

**STAY AT LEAST 500 YARDS AWAY** from right whales-it's the law. Be cautious when transiting areas where whales are present.

### Report

**REPORT** right whale sightings and any whales or sea turtles in distress to NOAA Fisheries Greater Atlantic Marine Animal Reporting Hotline 866-755-6622 or to the U.S. Coast Guard on VHF 16.
