1000	<p>Station Bill Development</p> <p>Students are split into assigned vessels, and will create station bills for the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • POB • Flood • Fire • Abandon ship <p>Mayday review</p>
1045	<p>PFD</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Manually inflate • Demonstrate H.E.L.P. & Huddle positions <p>Immersion Suit</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inspect, wax • Test all attachments • Remove all attachments <p>Life Raft (all students will physically perform each task)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Set up hydrostatic • Manually launch • Right life raft • Actions once inside the raft & preparing for rescue

1430	<p>Vessel Drills and Skills</p> <p>Single Group</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <u>Pre-brief</u> (Jenna) <u>Vessel Orientation</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will board the vessel and orient themselves. They should locate all safety items <p><u>DRILL TIME</u></p>



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	<p>Class will divide into assigned vessels and perform drills using the station bill created earlier in class.</p> <p>C. <u>Drill</u> Each vessel will perform a basic drill following using their station bills.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Drills are debriefed immediately after each drill, led by instructor. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. POB Drill <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Treatment of hypothermic victim 2. FIRE drill 3. FLOODING drill <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Observers assemble and operate the dewatering pump stationed on the vessel 4. Abandon ship drill <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Manually launch life raft ○ Don immersion suits in 60 seconds or less <p>During both drills, students will use their cell phones to make a Mayday call to an instructor who will report whether the Mayday was understood.</p> <p>D. Life Raft</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students abandon ship dry into the life raft. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Actions once inside • SAR in sight, exit raft and 2. Perform swim skills <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Chain ➤ Star ➤ Mat 3. Right over turned raft 4. Enter raft from the water <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Throw quoit to help retrieve at least one person <p>E. Rescue Basket</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Enter Rescue basket individually (USCG) ○ Those in water still maintaining formation for rescue <p>F. Enter harbor from a height (only if conditions are safe)</p> <p>Drill Debrief Each vessel will be debriefed & critiqued</p> <p>G. Practice throwing life ring and life sling</p>
1630	Clean up: rinse salt water from immersion suits and any other item in contact with ocean.
