


Figure 6. Percent income from any activity in commercial fishing. TOP = Bold, MID = Underline.




Figure 7. Likert scale response ratings for job stability. TOP = Bold, MID = Underline.



2012 Pacific Coast Groundfish Fishery Social Study Interview Guide

Scenario 1: Participant has completed a survey. Utilize the following questions in a supplemental interview:

1. Is there anything else we should know that we haven't included in the survey?
 - a. What should people know about what you do (the role you play in commercial fishing)?
2. Do you have concerns about the catch shares program that weren't captured in the survey?
3. Do you think the management change of the trawl groundfish and whiting fisheries affected other fisheries as well? (Consider both non-management and management effect.)
 - a. How has the change affected other fisheries?
 - b. Do you think the management of other fisheries changed as well?
4. Is there anyone else you think we should speak with?
 - a. Can I tell them you gave me their name?

Scenario 2: Survey is dropped off with an individual for completion independently (without researcher) but interview is conducted in-person (with researcher).

1. Do you have any concerns/comments about the new catch shares system?
2. Do you think the management change of the trawl groundfish and whiting fisheries affected other fisheries as well? (Consider both non-management and management effect.)
 - a. How has the change affected other fisheries?
 - b. Do you think the management of other fisheries changed as well?
3. Do you consider this community – where you live/deliver fish – a fishing community?
4. How long have you been fishing?
5. Does anyone else in your family fish?
6. Is there anyone else you think we should speak with?

- a. Can I tell them you gave me their name?

Scenario 3: Participant declines to participate in the survey but is willing to interview.
